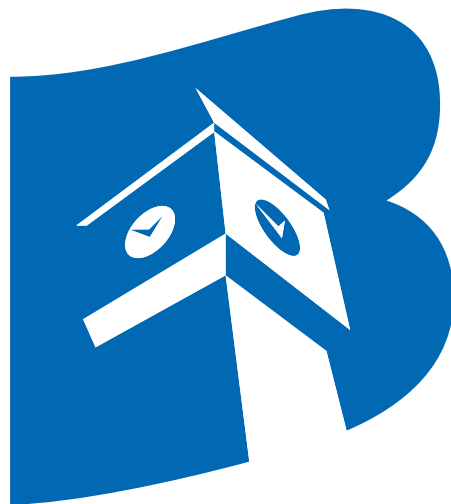

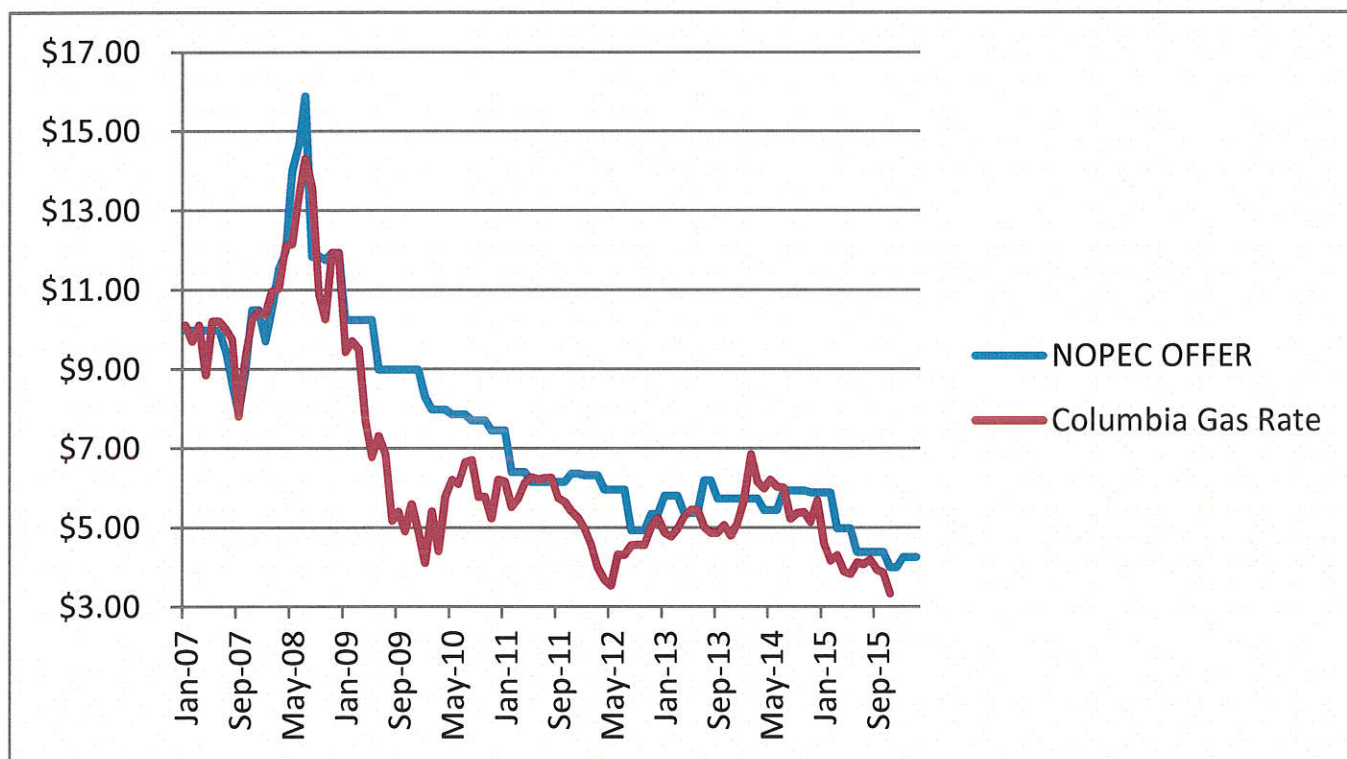

MOTION: Move to authorize the City Manager to enter into a two (2) year contract with DS Benefits Group for consulting services in assisting the City in managing its' group health and welfare plans, effective January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2017.

BACKGROUND: The City has used DS Benefits Group as a consultant to assist us with our health care needs since January 2006. They have been instrumental in negotiating the best rates possible with health carriers.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: Health insurance is a complicated benefit to understand and manage. It is important to have experts in this field to assist in navigating renewals and health care reform.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: We would appreciate the motion being passed at the December 14, 2015 meeting in order for it to be in effect January 1, 2016.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: Amount: \$20,000 annually, paid in monthly installments.

The 2016 Council budget has been adopted and the Finance Director certificate will thus be limited to 2016 in the amount of \$20,000. Acct #001-0880-54276.

2017 budget has not been legally adopted and Finance Director certificate will be contingent upon the adoption of the 2017 budget.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Pass the motion at the December 14, 2015 Committee of the Whole Meeting in order to execute the contract before January 1, 2016.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: DS Benefits Group has charged the same annual amount since 2006.

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE PASSAGE OF HOUSE
BILL 394 BY THE OHIO GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

WHEREAS: House Bill 394 proposes to significantly reduce unemployment benefits in the
State of Ohio; and

WHEREAS: If passed, House Bill 394 would have a significant effect on Ohio workers.

WHEREAS: THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1: This Council does hereby declare its opposition to House Bill 394.

SECTION 2: This Council urges its state legislators to reject House Bill 394.

SECTION 3: That the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified
copy of this Resolution to the Ohio House of Representatives and Senate upon
the effective date hereof.

SECTION 4: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary
for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, and safety and for
the additional reason that this Council desires to indicate its opposition to House
Bill 394 as soon as possible. This Resolution shall be effective upon receipt of
the requisite number of votes or from the earliest time allowed by law.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE GREATER CLEVELAND REGIONAL TRANSIT AUTHORITY
AND
CITY OF BRUNSWICK

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into as of this _____ day of _____, 2015, by and between the **Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority** (hereinafter the "Authority" or "GCRTA"), having an office located at 1240 W. 6th St., Cleveland, Ohio 44113 and the City of Brunswick, (hereinafter "Grantee") whose business address is 4095 Center Road, Brunswick, Ohio 44212.

WITNESSETH: THAT

WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration ("FTA") apportions funds each year to the urban transit systems in Ohio under Section 5307 of Title 49 of the United States Code ("Section 5307"), based on their transit data; and

WHEREAS, GCRTA is a designated recipient of federal formula financial assistance in the Cleveland Urbanized Area ("CUZA"); and

WHEREAS, the FTA designates a portion of the federal formula financial assistance to unserved areas ("Unserved Areas Formula Funds") within the CUZA; and

WHEREAS, the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency ("NOACA") Transit Council is responsible for determining the distribution of the Unserved Areas Formula Funds; and

WHEREAS, Grantee provides public transportation service within the CUZA; and

WHEREAS, the NOACA Transit Council awarded \$147,060 in Unserved Areas Formula Funds to Grantee; and

WHEREAS, GCRTA agreed to accept said funds from FTA on behalf of Grantee.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, this Agreement is made to set forth the terms and conditions upon which GCRTA will accept Section 5307 funds from FTA on behalf of Grantee and disburse local dollars ("Operating Funds") to Grantee and the terms and conditions under which Grantee will use the local dollars. GCRTA will apply the funds to its' capital program.

SECTION 1: Based upon mutual consent between Grantee and GCRTA, GCRTA will apply for and accept One Hundred Forty Seven Thousand Sixty Dollars (\$147,060.00) in 2015 Unserved Areas Formula Funds on behalf of Grantee. GCRTA

agrees to administer the federal funds pursuant to and in accordance with the terms of the applicable FTA grant agreement and conditions and within its capital program.

SECTION 2: GCRTA will transfer One Hundred Forty Seven Thousand Sixty Dollars (\$147,060.00) in operating funds to Grantee upon receipt of the 2015 Section 5307 unserved area funds from FTA.

SECTION 3: Grantee agrees to use the operating funds only for the purpose of public transportation.

SECTION 4: The parties agree that this constitutes the entire Agreement between the Parties hereto, that there are no agreements or understandings, implied or expressed except as specifically set forth below, and that all prior agreements and understandings are merged into and contained in this Agreement.

SECTION 5: Grantee shall be responsible for and hold GCRTA harmless from and against all findings for recovery issued by FTA or any other agency of competent jurisdiction, and any and all other claims, actions, judgments, costs, penalties, liabilities, damages, losses and expenses related to the application and/or disbursement of funds on behalf of Grantee under this Agreement or any misappropriation or use of the operating funds that is not in accordance with the terms of this agreement up to the total sum of funds transferred pursuant to this Agreement.

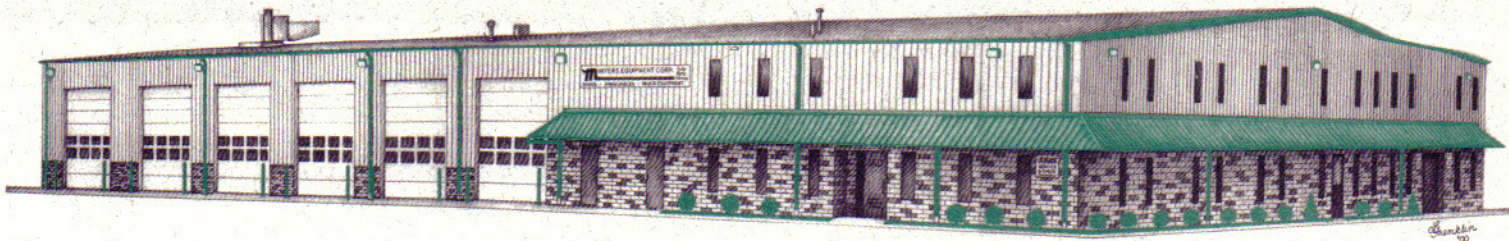

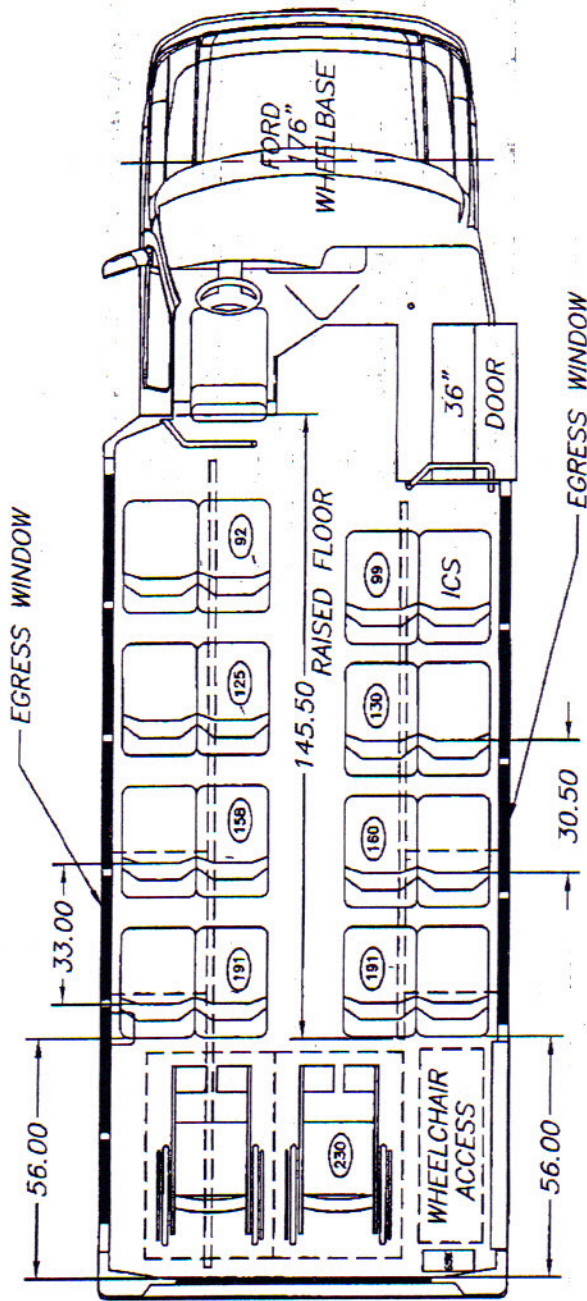

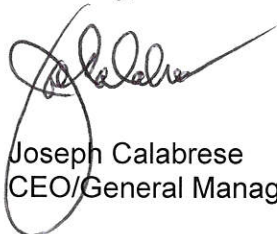

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE GREATER CLEVELAND REGIONAL TRANSIT AUTHORITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACCEPTING 2015 UNSERVED AREA FORMULA FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$147,060.00 AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH MYERS EQUIPMENT CORP. FOR THE PURCHASE OF THREE (3) 2016 FORD ELDORADO AEROTECH PASSENGER BUSES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$184,575.00.

WHEREAS: The Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (“NOACA”) has been awarded 2015 Unserved Area Formula Funds from the Federal Transit Administration (“FTA”) pursuant to Sections 5307 and 5339 of Title 49 of the United States Code and awarded funds in the amount of \$147,060.00 to the City of Brunswick, who provides public transportation services within the Cleveland Urbanized Area (“CUZA”);

WHEREAS: The Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (“GCRTA”) is the designated recipient of such funds in the CUZA;

WHEREAS: Pursuant to the terms of the Agreement between the City and GCRTA, GCRTA will accept such awarded funds on behalf of the City and transfer same to the City for use for public transportation purposes;

WHEREAS: The City of Brunswick belongs to the State Procurement Program under the direction of the Department of Administrative Services; and

WHEREAS: The State contract, under State Procurement Program, has been awarded to Myers Equipment Corp.

WHEREAS: THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: The City Manager is hereby authorized enter into an Agreement with the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, as attached hereto as Exhibit “A”, for the purpose of accepting 2015 Unserved Area Formula Funds in the amount of \$147,060.00.

SECTION 2: The City Manager is hereby authorized, upon approval of the Law Director, to enter into an Agreement with Myers Equipment Corp. for the purchase of three (3) 2016 Ford ElDorado Aerotech passenger buses in an amount not to exceed \$184,575.00.

SECTION 3: Therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the required number of votes or from the earliest time allowed by law.
