MINUTES OF COUNCIL
MONDAY, JANUARY 14, 2019

Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance: The regular meeting of Brunswick City Council was called to order by Mayor Ron Falconi at 7:30 p.m. at the Municipal Complex.

Roll Call of Members showed the following Council Members present: Anthony Capretta, Brian Ousley, Joseph Delsanter, Joseph Salzgeber, Michael Abella Jr., Nicholas Hanek, and Patricia Hanek.

Others Present: Mayor Ron Falconi, Council Clerk Fijabi Julien-Gallam, City Manager Carl S. DeForest and Law Director Ken Fisher.

Correspondence: There was none.

Approval of regular Council Meeting Minutes dated December 17, 2018:

Michael Abella Jr. moved to approve the Regular Council Meeting Minutes dated December 17, 2018, as written, seconded by Patricia Hanek. Roll Call - Ayes - 6, Anthony Capretta, Brian Ousley, Joseph Delsanter, Michael Abella Jr., Nicholas Hanek, Patricia Hanek. Nays - 0. Motion Carried.

Mayor's Report:

Mayor's Court Financial Report for the month ending December 2018 will be posted on the website and added to the minutes for the record.

Presentation from the Brunswick Food Pantry:

Councilman Brian Ousley remarked that Bob and Phyllis Seidler is a member of the Holy Trinity Church. He noted that over the last 6 years he proposed a resolution every January to urge the community to help the food pantry. The food pantry covers the Northern Medina County. Mr. Ousley presented a check and an abundance of food to Bob and Phyllis Seidler for the Brunswick Food Pantry.

Mrs. Seidler expressed her appreciation for the recognition. She noted that in 2018 the Brunswick Food Pantry served 2,224 families, which consist of 7,162 individuals. That was 2,112 children and 1,250 seniors out of 7,162 individuals. The food pantry gives out a 3-day supply of food which is about 64,458 meals. The individual must meet the government guidelines, provide a picture ID and show proof of residency to receive any food from the Brunswick Food Pantry. Mrs. Seidler explained that the Brunswick Food Pantry received 120,000 pounds of food from the Akron Food Bank. She remarked that the Brunswick Food Pantry also accepted food from many organizations, and they received thousands of personal donations. The food pantry purchased multiple items from local businesses. She noted that cash donations are appreciated. The pantry is staffed with volunteers and is supported by donations. The food pantry is looking for more food because this is an ongoing issue.

Law Director Ken Fisher remarked that pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 709.04, the City Council must accept or reject the petition for annexation of 25.0 acres from Brunswick Hills Township to the City of Brunswick. This petition was submitted by the property owner to be approved by the Medina Board of County Commissioners at a hearing on October 18, 2018. The City Council has to provide a decision after 60 days of the hearing.

Councilman Salzgeber announced that on Saturday, January 12, 2019, he was appointed by the Medina County Republican Party Central Committee as the new Medina County Recorder. He was sworn in on Monday, January 14, 2019, by Medina County Common Pleas Court Judge Collier. He explained that there is a concern among his colleagues regarding serving as a council member and as the Medina County Recorder. The Law Director is researching this issue. Mr. Salzgeber believed that the two positions are not incompatible based on Ohio Supreme Court Case Law, and based on the Attorney General's opinion. He noted that he is going to abstain from all votes until the Law Director has a

definitive opinion on this issue.

City Manager's Report:

City Manager Carl DeForest

- Thanked Katelyn Morris and her volunteers for organizing the 2019 Relay for Life Chili Cookoff. He noted that the 2019 Relay for Life event is on June 8, 2019, in Medina. Brunswick and Medina are combining their efforts to increase participation.
- Reminded everyone that the City Manager's newsletter is scheduled to come out soon. The newsletter is attached to the refuse bill. He recommended the residents to save the newsletter, and hang it on their refrigerator to reference the city's directory and updates.
- Urged everyone to keep all fire hydrants clear of snow.

Administrative Departments:

Police Chief Brian Ohlin

- Remarked that if there is a snowfall that exceeds 2-inches the city would declare a snow emergency for a parking ban on city streets. The snow parking ban alerts would be on many media outlets. This ban would allow the service trucks to clear the snow off the city streets.
- Remarked that it is required for property owners (business and residential owners) to keep their sidewalks cleared of snow.
- Remarked that all private snow removal contractors are required to register with the city for a permit.

Community & Economic Development Director Grant Augst

- Announced that the Geeked Out Restaurant and Bar is opening up in the Brunswick Town Center. This restaurant is a Sci-Fi theme property, and it is near the Brunswick Comfort Suites Hotel.
- Announced that Murphy Tractor construction is moving along in the Industrial Parkway South. He explained that Murphy Tractor is expected to bring more jobs to the city.
- Remarked that Controlled Access is scheduled to start construction in a couple of months across from Murphy Tractor. This business would bring more jobs to the city.

Service Superintendent Ryan Lutz

- Remarked that over the weekend the Service Department workers were on the streets for 24 hours. He explained that they used 250 tons of salt in that 24 hour period. The city still has 3,000 tons of salt left. He expressed that the city still has enough salt.
- Remarked that the water main break at Boyer Drive and State Route 303 is expected to take two weeks to repair.
- Noted that the city opened up bids for the refuse collection on Tuesday, January 8, 2019. The Administration is still reviewing those bids.

Parks and Recreation Director John Piepsny

- Announced that the Medina County Office of Older Adults released the Seniors Publication for

the community to stay up-to-date with what is going on in the city.

- Remarked that the Brunswick Seniors Expo is on Friday, January 18, 2019, from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM at the Recreation Center. This event is free. The event will offer free bakery, free coffee, free health screenings, and hand out the 2019 trip brochures.
- Added that the city is preparing to apply for the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) Grant for the development of the first phase of the Brunswick Lake trail from Plum Creek.
