MONDAY, JANUARY 28, 2019

Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance: The regular meeting of Brunswick City Council was called to order by Mayor Ron Falconi at 7:30 p.m. at the Municipal Complex.

Roll Call of Members showed the following Council Members present: Brian Ousley, Joseph Delsanter, Joseph Salzgeber, Nicholas Hanek, and Patricia Hanek.

Others Present: Council Clerk Fijabi Julien-Gallam, Mayor Ron Falconi, City Manager Carl S. DeForest, and Law Director Ken Fisher.

Nicholas Hanek moved to excuse Vice Mayor Michael Abella Jr. and Councilman Anthony Capretta with just cause, seconded by Joseph Delsanter. Roll Call - Ayes - 5, Brian Ousley, Joseph Delsanter, Joseph Salzgeber, Nicholas Hanek, Patricia Hanek. Nays - 0. Motion Carried.

Correspondence:

The Clerk of Council read a letter from Art Recovery Technologies of Cleveland. The owner from Art Recovery Technologies of Cleveland wrote a letter thanking Officer John Fink for his quick response regarding an incident that occurred on January 14, 2019.

Mayor's Report:

Presentation from the Brunswick Rotary Club - James Collins:

Brunswick Rotary Club President James Collins and members of the Brunswick Rotary Club donated a new Thermal Imaging Camera to the Brunswick Division of Fire. Mr. Collins mentioned that this fundraiser started in the year 2018. He explained that the Division of Fire lost their old Thermal Imaging Camera in an apartment complex fire. He noted that by not having another Thermal Imaging Camera is hindered the Division of Fire capabilities. This equipment is very important for the Division of Fire. The equipment would allow the firefighters to detect heat and heat in an environment that they can't see through smoke.

SERVPRO of Medina - Make a Wish Donation:

Christine Kanis, a representative from SERVPRO of Medina County, explained that they sponsored a ball game for first responders. She announced that out of 17 brackets that were submitted, the Brunswick Division of Fire was won the challenge. City Manager's Report:

City Manager Carl DeForest

- Thanked the Service Department for their efforts during the recent snow event. He noted that the members from the Special Service, Utilities, Technology and Cable Committee discussed the snow removal issue. The goal of the discussion was to improve the city's services.
- Thanked Rotary President James Collins and the entire club for the donation of the Thermal Energy Camera. The camera is about \$8,000 to purchase. He continued to thank the Division of Fire for serving the community, and the Rotary Club for sponsoring and supporting the community.
- Thanked SERPRO for sponsoring the ball bracket competition. He noted that the Brunswick Division of Fire and the Brunswick Division of Police were the final two in the competition; however, the Division of Fire won.
- Remarked that the Recreation Community Center is available to the residents if there is a power outage. He thanked the Parks and Recreation Director for being flexible with servicing the community.
- Thanked Councilman Ousley and Councilman Capretta for assisting a resident with a destroyed cable box from the recent snow event. Mr. Ousley and Mr. Capretta helped recover the cable box by shoveling the snow.

Administrative Departments:

Finance Director Todd Fischer

- Mentioned that the Finance Department recently finalized the 2018 financial books for the City of Brunswick, and opened 2019 financial books.
- Acknowledged the financial staff for their hard work.
- Remarked that the Finance Department provides local tax services for free for the Brunswick residents.

Fire Chief Josh Erskine

- Requested the residents to keep their driveways clean during a heavy snow event.
- Advised the residents to clear any snow that is surrounding or covering a fire hydrant on the tree lawn. This assistance saves the Division of Fire valuable time in case of an emergency.
- Recommended residents to use an approved space heater when experiencing severe cold in the house and during low-temperature weather.
- Advised the residents to put the fireplace ashes in a metal bucket outside when using a fireplace.

Service Director Paul Barnett

- Thanked Superintendent Ryan Lutz that oversees snow and ice for everything he did during the recent 21-day heavy snow event. He also thanked the service workers for their hard work and dedication to serve the community during the recent 21-day heavy snow event.
- Explained that there is always room for improvement in the service department, and there are plans to continue having discussions on how to serve the community better.

Parks and Recreation Director John Piepsny

- Announced that the City Manager's 1 Million Steps Challenge signups are from February 4, 2019, to February 28, 2019. The challenge starts on March 1, 2019, to March 31, 2019. To participate in the challenge, a team of four has to reach an average shared amount of 1 Million steps by the end of the challenge. The winning team will receive a T-Shirt for accepting and completing the challenge.
- Remarked that the Recreation Center is offering a 50% off sale for yearly memberships from February 14, 2019, to February 28, 2019.

Open Forum:

Snow Removal Concern

James Evanoff at 3649 Ascot Dr. inserted the following statement to the minutes.

Good Evening,

Tonight I am here seeking answers to how the city handled snow removal in Ward 2 during the blizzard on January 19, 20 and 21, 2019. I have been a resident on Ascot Drive for six years. I have never experienced a lack of snow removal service in my neighborhood on January 19, 20 and 21, 2019. During previous storms of the same or greater magnitude were handled more professionally than this storm in question.

I am not saying my neighborhood or any other neighborhood should receive better treatment. I am aware that main streets such as Center Road, Laurel Road, Pearl Road, and Carpenter Road need to take priority. I saw that the city plowed Brunswick Lake Drive, Chelsea Drive, Scarborough Drive, and parts of Sandlewood Drive before 6:30 AM, on Sunday, January 20, 2019. The following streets were impossible to drive on - Devonshire Drive, Wiltshire Drive, Dorchester Drive, Ascot Drive and Sandlewood Drive west of Scarborough Drive. Due to the snow emergency parking ban, I was forced to park my car at Giant Eagle and walk home. At 4:00 PM that afternoon, my neighborhood was not plowed, and I was forced to walk back to Giant Eagle

to retrieve my vehicle to go to work. I emailed Councilman Nick Hanek, Councilman Brian Ousley, Service Director Paul Barnett, and City Manager Carl DeForest about this issue. I received an email reply from Mr. Hanek the same day I sent the email. I received an email from Mr. Barnett the next day. Mr. Ousley responded to me by telephone to list to my concerns. At about 11:00 PM, on Sunday, January 20, 2019, Ascot Drive and Wiltshire Drive were finally plowed. I am respectfully asking the following questions.

- How many plow trucks and drivers do we have. Were they all in service and manned the evening of January 20, 2019?
- How are the routes assigned?
- How long does it take to clear a Ward during the first round?
- What change is going to be made to ensure efficient snow removal?

Unfinished Business:
