City Manager's Report:

City Manager Carl DeForest

- Reminded everyone that July 4, 2019, is Independence Day and City Hall is not open on this day. During the holiday week, refuse pick-up is one day late for Thursday and Friday pick-up.
- Reminded everyone that solicitors have to have a permit to solicit door to door in the City of Brunswick. The solicitor has to provide the resident with a copy of their permit if the resident requests to see a permit. Mr. DeForest remarked that there are "NO SOLICITING" signs available at City Hall for residents to post on their property.
- Noted that the Brunswick Food Pantry is still accepting food at City Hall during business hours.

Administrative Departments:

Finance Director Todd Fischer

- Remarked that the Auditors had their Post Audit meeting to report the results of the city's financial audit. Mr. Fischer expressed that he was surprised that the auditors did not have any comments to put in their report. He thanked all of the hard workers of the City of Brunswick and everyone that was involved in the auditing process.

Service Director Paul Barnett

- Remarked that on June 24, 2019, the Medina County Solid Waste Authority is now accepting appliances with Freon at the Seville location. It is \$10 for each appliance to drop off at the Seville location.
- Remarked that North Carpenter Road is currently under construction. Mr. Barnett advised everyone to avoid traveling on North Carpenter Road. The project is right on schedule.
- Announced that cart delivery has started for the waste and recycling collection program in Brunswick. Each resident is getting a 96-gallon trash cart, and a 96-gallon recycle cart. He anticipated taking about three weeks to get all carts out to the residents. There is an information packet attached to the trash cans for residents to learn about the new program, and more information is available on the city's website.

Parks and Recreation Director John Piepsny

- Remarked that Logan Wells is playing with Blue Midnight at the Brunswick Recreation Center stage from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., on Sunday, June 30, 2019.
- Added that the tennis court at Neura Park is scheduled to be under construction starting on Wednesday, July 3, 2019. This project should last for one week.
- Remarked that the Community Band is playing all the patriotic favorites at the Brunswick Recreation Center stage from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. followed by the City of Brunswick's fireworks on Wednesday, July 3, 2019, at approximately 10:00 p.m. The rain date for the fireworks is Friday, July 5, 2019.

Open Forum:

Brunswick Lake Park Dinosaur Trail

Glen Kuban, at 4726 Grayton Road, Cleveland, expressed that he spoke at the Regular City Council meeting on June 10, 2019, about keeping the Dinosaur Trail at the Brunswick Lake Park. He covered many positive attributes of the trail. Mr. Kuban reiterated that the trail being a hazard could be addressed by doing low-cost maintenance. He explained that it is not wise to move the trail to another park because it is expensive and it is a lot of work. Mr. Kuban asked residents in the city for their opinions on the trail, and most do not have a strong desire to take out the trail. Mr. Kuban advised the officials to go to the Brunswick Lake Park, and ask the people visiting the park for their opinions on the trail. Mr. Kuban concluded that there is no compelling reason to move the tracks, and there are many good reasons to leave the trail at the park. The trail should be advertised more to the public instead of being removed. He added that he received over 90 signatures to petition the decision to remove the trail.

Sherry McKenzie expressed that she would like to offer her support for the dinosaur tracks in the park. Ms. McKenzie has had many chances to enjoy the trail at the park. She explained that her cousins her fascinated with the dinosaur trail. When Ms. McKenzie visits the trail, she is also spending money in the community as well by going out to eat or going grocery shopping. She hoped

that the elected officials and administration would think twice before removing the dinosaur trail.

Unfinished Business:

Councilman Joseph Delsanter remarked that he visited the Dinosaur Trail at the Brunswick Lake Park. He is aware that there might be a trip hazard at the trail. He noticed that there are things that are going to leave the park that the Medina County Park District and Brunswick Lake Ad Hoc Committee suggested. The Dinosaur Trail and the Nature Center seem to be one of the few educational pieces in the park. The trail is not in the middle of the park. Mr. Delsanter expressed that he did not see the trail being worthy of being torn out, and maybe a path is needed to go along the trail to keep the trail safer. He explained that this trail is a big deal for the children in the community. Mr. Delsanter expressed that he would like to keep the trail in the Brunswick Lake Park.
