MOTION: Motion authorizing the City Manager to advertise for public bids for the South Industrial - Westway Improvements

BACKGROUND: New request

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: This project will facilitate the reconstruction of South Industrial Parkway between Center Road and just south of the Medina Supply entrance. The remaining portion of South Industrial and Westway Drive will receive slab:joint and catch basin repairs. This project is being partially funded by grants from ODOT Jobs and Commerce and (if approved by ODOT) the Medina County Transportation Improvement District.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: Bidding will occur this fall, with construction being completed in Spring 2020.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: Once bids are received, they will be analyzed and reviewed. In order to be awarded, all project costs must be budgeted and must follow any and all grant guidelines. It is typical that contracts cannot be executed or awarded until after grant approval is received. Authorized City costs for this project will be paid from the Road Improvement Fund #333, while grant related costs are expected to be paid in accordance with the grant requirements, once known.

PRELIMINARY ESTIMATE OF PROJECT COST

Project Scope:

The proposed project aims to reconstruct South Industrial Parkway from Center Road to just beyond the southern entrance to Medina Supply (approx. 1,080 ft).
Also includes replacement of crossover pipe, basins, slabs at sag south of project limits, slabs on Westway, joint repairs on South Industrial and catch basin repairs on South Industrial / Westway
The proposed project includes removal and replacement of all concrete pavements, designated curb inlets, drive aprons as needed within the project area.

ORDINANCE NO. 51-19

BY: COMMITTEE-OF-THE-WHOLE

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE EDITING AND INCLUSION OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES AS COMPONENTS OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADOPTION OF NEW LEGISLATION IN THE UPDATED REVISED CODIFIED ORDINANCES; AND TO REPEAL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

- WHEREAS: Section 3.18b. of the City Charter provides for the general codification of all City ordinances and resolutions having the force and effect of law and requires that such codification be kept current; and
- WHEREAS: The Walter H. Drane Co. has completed its updating and revision of the Codified Ordinances of the City; and
- WHEREAS: Various ordinances of a general and permanent nature that have been enacted by Council since the date of the last updating and revision of the Codified Ordinances need to be include in the Codified Ordinances of the City; and
- WHEREAS: Certain changes made in the Codified Ordinances to bring City law into conformity with State law.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK HEREBY ORDAINS:

- SECTION 1: That the editing, arrangement and numbering or renumbering of the ordinances and parts of ordinances attached hereto as "Exhibit "A" as though fully herein written, are hereby approved as parts of the various component codes of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Brunswick, Ohio, so as to conform to the classification and numbering system of the Codified Ordinances.
- SECTION 2: That the sections of the Traffic and General Offenses Codes, as amended and attached hereto as Exhibit "B" as though fully herein written, are hereby approved and adopted as amended or enacted so as to conform to enactments of the Ohio General Assembly.
- SECTION 3: That all ordinances and resolutions and parts thereof that are in conflict with any of the provisions of the new matter approved, adopted and listed on Exhibit "A" and in Section 1 are hereby repealed, except as follows:
- (a) The enactment of such matter shall not be construed to affect a right of liability accrued or incurred under any legislative provision prior to the effective date of such enactment, or any action or proceeding for the enforcement of such right or liability. Such enactment shall not be construed to relieve any person from punishment for an act committed in violation of any such legislative provision or to affect an indictment or prosecution therefor. For such purposes, any such legislative provision shall continue in full force notwithstanding its repeal for the purposes of revision and recodification.
 - (b) The repeal provided above shall not affect any legislation enacted subsequent to July 21, 2019

SECTION 4: That a copy of this ordinance shall be posted in the five public places set forth in Section 222.01 of the Codified Ordinances, together with notice as to where copies of the April 2018 Replacement Pages for the Codified Ordinances of the City, hereby approved, adopted and enacted, may be viewed and inspected by the public. A copy shall also be furnished to City Officers, Medina County Law Library and the Brunswick Public Library.

SECTION 5: That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the additional reason that it is immediately necessary to have an up-to-date codification of the laws of the City, pursuant to Section 3.18b. of the City Charter, that is in conformity with State Law, where such conformity is required by Article XVIII, Section 3, of the Ohio Constitution, with which to administer the affairs of the City and to preserve law and order of the City. Therefore, this Ordinance and the July 2019 Replacement Pages for the Codified Ordinances, hereby approved, adopted and enacted, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the required number of votes, as set forth in Section 3.16 of the City Charter.
