City Manager's Report:

City Manager Car DeForest

- Thanked the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) #9520 and the American Legion Post 234 for sponsoring the Veterans Day Ceremony. Mr. DeForest thanked all of the veterans for attending the ceremony and for their service.
- Thanked everyone in the community for voting for a continuous Safety Levy.
- Remarked that Nicholas Olsan is in the audience, and Mr. Olsan is going to speak under Open Forum about an Eagle Scout project that is beneficial to veterans.

Administrative Departments:

Police Chief Brian Ohlin

- Provided safety reminders while driving in the winter.
- Noted that during the No Parking Ban, no cars are allowed to park on the city's street. When there are more than 2 inches of snow on the streets, the ban is enforced. This ban would allow

service workers to clear the streets.

- Added that no one in the city is allowed to park on the street between the hours of 2:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m.
- Mentioned that the Division of Police and the Division of Fire is involved in some area-wide training together with 11 other jurisdictions in the area. The training is for the rescue task force concept - Police and Fire working together in case of an emergency.

Assistant Finance Director Lynnette Ozanich

- Remarked that the 2020 Budget Proposal and Capital Program is scheduled to go to the Finance Committee and members of the council on Monday, November 18, 2019, at 6:30 p.m., in the City Hall's Lunchroom. The 2020 Budget Proposal and Capital Program are also scheduled to be presented to the Financial Audit Advisory Committee on Thursday, November 21, 2019, at 6:15 p.m., in the City Hall's Lunchroom

Park and Recreation Director John Piepsny

- Remarked that the recreation center is having their first ever glow night on Saturday, November 30, 2019, from 5:00 p.m. to midnight, for ages seven to fifteen. They planned to have a DJ, glow in the dark games, swimming with the lights on, movies, pizza, ice cream, popcorn, and much more.
- The Brunswick Recreation Center's annual Christmas Party is scheduled to be on Sunday, December 8, 2019, from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. They planned to have games, prizes, a DJ, snacks, and photos with Santa. This is a free event.

Open Forum:

Collection Drive for Veterans

Nicholas Olsan, at 1478 Jefferson Avenue, remarked that he is a Boy Scout from Troop 517. To achieve the rank of Eagle Scout, he is leading a collection service project for the Harry Donovan Jr. Homeless Veterans Shelter of Summit County. Mr. Olsan remarked that the home is a transitional housing program for homeless male veterans. The Valor Home is to support homeless veterans in the community in their efforts to achieve greater self-sufficiency, including the ability to secure and maintain permanent housing. He noted that he set-up an approved collection box in the lobby of City Hall for any donations that would go a long way in assisting those who have sacrificed much more for the country. Mr. Olsan concluded his request by thanking all veterans who have served.

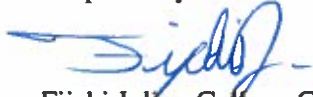
The City Council and the Administration had no objections to the liquor permit transfer request.
