MOTION: Motion authorizing the City Manager to advertise for public bids for the 2020 Asphalt Road Program;

BACKGROUND: The project will seek to improve residential concrete streets citywide by milling the existing surface, repairing deteriorated joints/slabs, and installing a new asphalt surface.

**PURPOSE AND
EXPLANATION:**

This project will consist of installing asphalt overlays on nearly 4 miles of residential concrete streets citywide. Each street will be milled to an average depth of 2 inches, followed by repairs to deteriorated joints and slabs. After the repairs are performed, the street will be chip sealed, followed by an asphalt overlay, then another chip seal and a black mastic surface seal. The finished product will be a smooth, cohesive, and consistent asphalt driving surface designed to dramatically extend the service life of the concrete street at a fraction of the cost of full replacement.

Work is proposed on all or part of the following streets:

Ward 1 - Alda Parkway, Bettie Lane, Gladys Drive

Ward 2 - Monte Vista Drive, El Camino Blvd, Monterey Circle, El Dorado Blvd, Villa Casa Ct

Ward 3 - Weathervane Lane, Sturbridge Drive, Morningview Terrace, Wellsley Place, Hampton Ct, Duxbury Lane

Ward 4 - Wolff Drive, Manitoulin Pike

**IMPLEMENTATION
SCHEDULE:**

Should authorization be secured at the February 24, 2020 Committee of the Whole meeting the project will be advertised and bid in March. Construction is anticipated to begin in spring and continue through the 2020 construction season.

SUMMARY:**

This project is being funded by a combination of residential street levy funds (Fund #332), additional state gas tax revenue (Fund #117), and the City's road improvement fund (#333). Preliminary construction cost estimate is \$2,250,000.

MOTION: Motion authorizing the City Manager to advertise for public bids for the 2020 Concrete Repair Program

BACKGROUND: This project will seek to improve residential and industrial concrete streets citywide by removing and replacing deteriorated slabs and joints.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: The project will consist of the removal and replacement of deteriorated slabs and joints on various concrete streets citywide. Approximately \$100,000 will be spent in the North Industrial Park, with the remainder of the work occurring on residential streets split approximately evenly between the four wards.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: Should authorization be granted at the February 24, 2020 Committee of the Whole meeting the project be advertised in late March and bid in April. Construction is anticipated to begin in May and will take approximately 90 days to complete.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: This project will be funded using local road improvement funds (Fund #333). Preliminary construction cost estimate is \$510,000.
