LEGISLATION: **RES. NO. 1-2021** - An emergency resolution pledging cooperation with the Medina County Engineer and setting aside funds in an amount not to exceed \$48,197.00 for the Sleepy Hollow Road resurfacing project.- **1st Reading** (To be brought from Services, Utilities, Technology & Cable Committee, *Administration/Matt Jones*)

BACKGROUND: The Medina County Engineer and Brunswick City Engineer submitted a joint application to the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) in November 2020 to fund a portion of this project. The remaining cost of the project will be split between the County and City on a frontage basis, with the City responsible for 27.7% of the local share.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: Project will facilitate the resurfacing of Sleepy Hollow Road. This project is being designed and administered by the Medina County Engineer and will be jointly funded by Medina County and the City of Brunswick. Total project cost estimate is \$669,220. OPWC grant funds are being sought in the amount of \$495,223 to cover a portion of the project. The legislation will set aside the City's share of the remaining estimated construction cost (\$48,197 or 27.7% of the total local match of \$173,997) and will pledge the City's cooperation with the County Engineer in contributing 27.7% of the local share of the project cost, not to exceed the \$48,197 set aside amount.

IMPLEMENTATION

SCHEDULE: The project is anticipated to commence in July 2021 pending successful bid results and award of OPWC funds.

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION PLEDGING COOPERATION WITH THE MEDINA COUNTY ENGINEER AND SETTING ASIDE FUNDS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$48,197.00 FOR THE SLEEPY HOLLOW ROAD RESURFACING PROJECT.

WHEREAS: In November of 2020, the Medina County Engineer and the Brunswick City Engineer submitted a joint application to the Ohio Public Works Commission for grant funds totaling \$495,223.00 to cover a portion of the Sleepy Hollow Road Resurfacing Project (the "Project"), the total cost of which is estimated at \$669,220.00;

WHEREAS: The remaining local share cost of the Project will be split between the County and the City on a frontage basis, with the City responsible for 27.7% of the remaining local share cost totaling \$48,197.00; and

WHEREAS: The Project is anticipated to commence in July of 2021 subject to pending successful bid results and award of OPWC grant funds.

WHEREAS: THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1: That the City hereby pledges its cooperation to the Medina County Engineer relative to the Project in an amount not to exceed \$48,197.00, subject to pending successful bid results and award of OPWC grant funds.

SECTION 2: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare, and for the additional reason that funds need to be allocated in anticipation of commencement of the Project in July of 2021. Therefore, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the required number of votes or from the earliest time allowed by law.
