ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

December 20, 2021

IN ATTENDANCE: Chairman Nicholas Hanek, Committee Member Joseph Delsanter, Committee Member Tom Miller, Michael Abella Jr., Valerie Zak, Brian Ousley, Anthony Capretta, City Engineer Matt Jones, Law Director Ken Fisher, City Manager Carl DeForest, Lieutenant Bob Safran, Acting Clerk of Council Clerk Pam Plavecski, Media

The meeting convened at 6:15 p.m.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

ORD. NO. 118-2021 – An emergency ordinance establishing Section 606.30 of the City of Brunswick Codified Ordinances by prohibiting unauthorized use of City logos, the seal of City Council and/or approved Safety Department emblems – **2nd Reading** (Committee-of-the-Whole, *Administration/Carl DeForest*)

Mr. Hanek said there were some revisions to the ordinance, due to some of the discussion that was held at the last committee meeting. Ken Fisher said it was amended to exempt use for fiscal City business and/or as previously approved. Mr. Hanek reiterated that this would allow City officials to take a picture with the City logo in the background or share a social media post.

Mr. Delsanter did add that the ordinance does allow for permission to be granted by the City to use the logo. Mr. Ousley asked if there could be financial gains brought to the City, if someone wants to use the logo. Mr. Fisher said this would be a decision that would be made by the City Manager. He pointed out that there may be an instance in which a non-profit organization wants to use the logo for a legitimate fundraiser. The City Manager would then determine, if that is consistent with our purpose and our charter. The way it reads now it is up to the authorization of the City Manager.

Mr. Ousley then asked if a for profit organization could use the logo for a fee. Mr. Fisher said that would be a decision for the City Manager and he would need to share that with Council. Council would need to have a complete understanding and discussion, before something like that would occur.

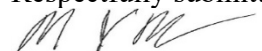
There was a discussion with the Mayor regarding his ability to take a picture with the City logo for cards, political campaigns, etc. Mr. Fisher and Council determined that because he is the Mayor for the City, this would not be a misrepresentation and would be permissible. Mr. Fisher reiterated that the ordinance's purpose is the prevent private entities from using the logo for a profit.

Mr. Miller made a motion to move Ordinance Number 118-2021 to tonight's Council agenda for a second reading. Vote – 3 Ayes, 0 Nays.

BUILDING AND BUILDING CODE COMMITTEE

December 20, 2021

The meeting convened at 6:04 p.m.

DISCUSSION ITEM:

(a) End of Year Report

Mr. Aungst said that they are incredibly busy. He said his team is solid and working well together. He noted that they did lose 1 team member to Council. They hope to have a new person joining them soon. He listed their current department staff as: Cliff, Drew, Robert, Jesse, Ray, Kim and Pam.

Mr. Aungst listed some of the projects that they have worked on in the 2021 calendar year which included: Brunswick Middle School stadium, Mitsubishi, Armbruster Moving, Burger King on 303, Human Bean, Marc's, Baskets Galore, Ber's, Trillium Creek, 360 Construction, ID Images, T & M Lanes, Bank of America, Ridgeline Chase, Meadowview, multiple dentist offices, Pet Supplies Plus, Links condos, etc.

He then told the committee the statistics for the work being done in the Building Department in 2021:

- 820 contractor registrations
- 2,257 building & zoning permits
- 58 zoning permits for residential accessory structures
- 185 residential plan reviews
- 101 commercial, industrial plan reviews
- 15 single new family homes
- 1,852 building inspections
- 53 foreclosures (102 inspections for potential)
- 95 grass and weeds
- 234 inspections
- 54 junk vehicles removed out of 56 inspections
- 594 temporary signs removed
- 51 CRA inspections

Mr. Aungst said they have had a lot going on aside from the different developments such as Meijer's. Mr. Aungst thanked Mr. Ousley, Mrs. Zak and Mr. Miller for their time on Council.

Mr. Ousley asked when Meijer's is expected to open. Mr. Aungst said they are expected to open in May.

Mr. Capretta he said he feels the Building Department did a very nice job in getting the Hickory Ridge Plaza paved. He asked if there are any prospective tenants for the plaza. Mr. Aungst said he thinks there is some interest and activity, but that is all that he can relay at this point.

Mr. Aungst said he is very proud of his team with 3 full time staff and the rest part-time. He said they do the best they can to serve the community and make them successful. Mr. Ousley suggested with the continued growth in the community, maybe they should consider hiring more full-time inspectors. Mr. Aungst said they recognize it is important to remain financially and fiscally responsible. Mr. Ousley said he did not want to overwork the current staff.

Mr. Abella asked if Scene 75 would be leaving the area. Mr. Aungst said not to his knowledge and that they do not appear to be going anywhere. He noted that they have locations in Brunswick, Cincinnati, Columbus, Dayton, Pittsburg and Chicago. This is a long-term investment and they expect to be here a long time. Their family group owns the plaza. It is important that they stay here and support themselves.

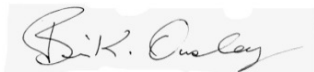

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MEETING

January 10, 2022

The meeting convened at 6:15 p.m.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

(a) Discussion and Motion to appoint Vice Mayor of Council

Mr. Fisher explained that per Council Rules Section 3.10, the election of a Vice Mayor and Vice Mayor Pro Tem must occur during the first meeting in January after an election. Mr. Delsanter thanked Mr. Abella for doing a commendable job as the Vice Mayor. He said he has a lot of respect for Mr. Hanek and that he is fair, intelligent, and a good listener.

Mr. Abella entertained a motion to appoint a Vice Mayor of Council to serve a 2-year term. Mr. Delsanter made a motion to appoint Nicholas Hanek as the Vice Mayor of Council, seconded by Mr. Capretta. Mr. Abella asked if there were any other nominations for Vice Mayor, there being none he proceeded to take the vote. Vote – 7 Ayes, 0 Nays.

(b) New Vice Mayor to choose Vice Mayor Pro Tem

Mr. Hanek said Councilman Delsanter has been a steady, guiding force for the City. Mr. Hanek selected Mr. Delsanter to serve as Vice Mayor Pro Tem.

(c) Discussion on Seat Assignments

Mr. Hanek said that, according to Council Rules, seat assignments go by seniority. He said that any adjustments can be made at the next meeting.

(d) Review of Council Rules 2020-2021 for any changes

Mr. Abella confirmed with Mr. Fisher that Council can vote to make any amendments to the Council Rules at the next scheduled meeting.

Mr. Fisher said that Section 3.13(d) states that Council can make changes, amendments, or revisions by the third regular meeting of the new year, which would be February 14 (this year). Council should

review and present changes for consideration to the Vice Mayor at the next meeting. He noted that the changes would then be adopted at the first meeting in February (February 14).

Mr. Abella asked Council to present any revisions to the Council Rules at the next meeting. He suggested they send an email with the changes prior to the meeting, so that members can be prepared to discuss them.

(e) Discussion of Committee assignments

Mr. Hanek asked that members of Council submit an email to him with the top 3 committees they would prefer to serve on by the end of the business day on Friday. He will do his best to accommodate everyone.

(f) Consideration to reschedule 2022 Council Meetings with legal holiday conflicts

Mr. Hanek said Council will have a meeting on Columbus Day, as they have in year's past. He did

Mr. Abella made a motion to reschedule the second Council meeting in the month of December to Monday, December 19 due to the holiday. Vote – 7 Ayes, 0 Nays.

MOTION ITEMS:

- a) Motion to approve payment to Software Solutions Inc. in the amount of \$25,978.18 for annual software support for the period of 2/01/2022 through 1/31/2023. This support covers various receipts, accounts payable, payroll, refuse billing and storm water billing software support services.

Mr. Fischer said the cost of the software has increased by approximately 4%, since last year. However, this software is a lot less expensive than other software programs and is a pretty good software program for the price. He said this software covers accounts payable, payroll, all receipt functionality, refuse and storm water billing.

Mr. Delsanter made a motion to approve payment to Software Solutions Inc. in the amount of \$25,978.18 for annual software support for the period of 2/01/2022 through 1/31/2023. Vote – 7 Ayes, 0 Nays.

- b) Motion to appoint Clerk of Council Laura Timura as Designee for all elected officials to attend public records training as required by Section 149.43 and 109.43 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Mrs. Piper made a motion to appoint Clerk of Council, Laura Timura, as Designee for all elected officials to attend public records training as required by Section 149.43 and 109.43 of the Ohio Revised Code. Vote – 7 Ayes, 0 Nays.

REVIEW LEGISLATION:

- (a) **RES. NO. 1-2022** - An emergency resolution granting consent to the Director of the Ohio Department of Transportation to complete lighting luminaire replacements and a lighting tower replacement on Interstate 71. - 1st Reading (To be brought from Committee-of-the-Whole, Administration/Matt Jones)

Mr. Jones said this is for a lighting replacement project that is being done by ODOT. He requires a resolution for the I-71 project, because a portion of the freeway falls in the City of Brunswick. The resolution will authorize ODOT to proceed with the upgrade of overhead lighting and the replacement of 1 light tower in the interchange of I-71 and 303. This project is being handled and paid for by ODOT. This will be an emergency with suspension of the rules to accommodate ODOT's deadline.

Mr. Capretta made a motion to move Resolution Number 1-2022 as emergency, with suspension of the rules to tonight's Council agenda. Vote – 7 Ayes, 0 Nays.

- (b) **RES. NO. 2-2022** - An emergency resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources for the Healey Creek Flood Mitigation-Magnolia Storm Relief Sewer Project. - 1st Reading - (To be brought from Committee-of-the-Whole, Administration/Matt Jones)

Mr. Jones said this is pertaining to the Magnolia Storm Relief Sewer Project that it has already been advertised and bid out. It has not been awarded yet, because this agreement with ODNR still outstanding. This resolution will authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with ODNR.

Mr. Lambert made a motion to move Resolution Number 2-2022 to tonight's Council agenda as emergency, with suspension of the rules. Vote – 7 Ayes, 0 Nays.

- (c) **RES. NO. 3-2022** - An emergency resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into a Housing Revolving Loan Fund Administration Agreement with the Ohio Department of Development. - 1st Reading (To be brought from Committee-of-the-Whole, Administration/Grant Aungst)

Mr. Fisher said we have until January 21st to accept the agreement with the Ohio Department of Development. He explained that for this reason, the resolution is emergency, with suspension of the rules.

Mr. Smith made a motion to move Resolution Number 3-2022 to tonight's Council agenda as emergency, with suspension of the rules. Vote – 7 Ayes, 0 Nays.

Mr. Fisher noted that most of the public records requests that are received are run reports through the EMS, fire or police department. Sometimes we get other report requests through the administrative services department, but the law department and City Manager are often involved. He stated that the law department will review and make sure what goes out complies with the statutes. If you get a public record request, you should make sure you refer it to the Council president who will then forward it. Mr. Fisher said there is a procedure and we follow it closely.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

Mr. Hanek said he would like to have a goal setting session and develop priorities. He would like to consider some dates to come together for goal setting and suggested getting together on a Monday, when there is not a Council meeting.

Mr. Lambert said that when he toured the City, he noticed that the conditions of the fire stations are poor. He understands that there is money set aside for improvements, but he does not feel that those funds would be enough to accomplish all of the improvements that are needed. Councilman Capretta and Smith

agreed that this issue should be addressed. Mr. Lambert said he feels there may be health concerns, due to the conditions.

Mr. Delsanter noted that there are other cities in the area that have fire stations in similar condition. He indicated that, from his experience with the fire department, they make the tools that save lives their top priority. He said the residents in the City want to maintain the taxes at a tolerable level, which can make it difficult to accomplish all of the goals for the fire station.

Roll Call – Ayes – 7, Mr. Hanek, Mr. Lambert, Mr. Abella Jr., Mr. Capretta, Mr. Delsanter, Mr. Smith, Mrs. Piper, Nays – 0. Motion Carried.

Mr. Abella moved to adjourn from Executive Session, seconded by Mr. Smith. Roll Call – Ayes - 7, Mr. Smith, Mr. Delsanter, Mrs. Piper, Mr. Hanek, Mr. Abella Jr., Mr. Capretta, Mr. Lambert. Nays – 0. Motion Carried.

ADJOURNMENT:

Being no further business, Mr. Abella moved to adjourn the Committee of the Whole Meeting at 7:07 p.m. Vote – 7 Ayes, 0 Nays.

LEGISLATION: **RES. NO. 6-2022-** An emergency resolution authorizing the City manager to enter into a one (1) year contract for property, automobile, inland marine, general liability, public officials liability, police liability, boiler and machines, crime coverage, cyber coverage, employment practice and umbrella insurance coverage. - **1st Reading** (To be brought from Committee-of-the-Whole, *Administration/Jim Foster*)

BACKGROUND: Our current insurance policy will expire on January 31, 2022. We must enter into a new contract to insure equipment, property, buildings, etc. from February 1, 2022 through January 31, 2023.

Love Insurance Agency obtained proposals for this coverage.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: To provide insurance coverage for equipment, property, facilities, etc. effective February 1, 2022.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE:

As soon as allowed by law.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY:

The liability insurance policy is from February 1, 2022 through January 31, 2023 at a total premium amount not to exceed \$324,757. The total premium amount includes 1) an annual premium of \$258,915 for various insurance coverages pertaining to property, employer, employee, vehicles, etc.; 2) annual premium of \$3,542 for separate crime coverage; 3) \$42,300 annual premium for separate cyber coverage and 4) requested additional premium amount not to exceed \$20,000 for prorated premium adjustments for City property removed from and/or added to coverage during this policy year, which would result in additional premium amounts due from the City. In order to be paid, expenditures must be covered by sufficient Council appropriations. Expenditures will be posted to the respective fund and department based on the items or persons being insured. This request is 7.51% more than that approved last year via

Resolution #6-2021. The higher than expected increase is due to the significant increase in cyber insurance coverage.

In order to cover any reasonable deductibles for any insurance claims during 2022, it may be necessary to submit a corresponding budget amendment pertaining to the quoted 2022 cyber insurance costs. The budget amendment legislation is expected to be presented to the Finance Committee in the near future.

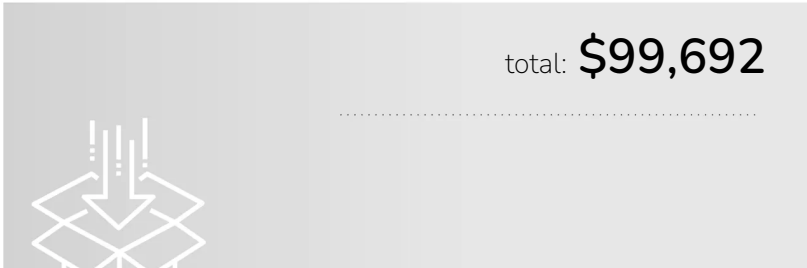

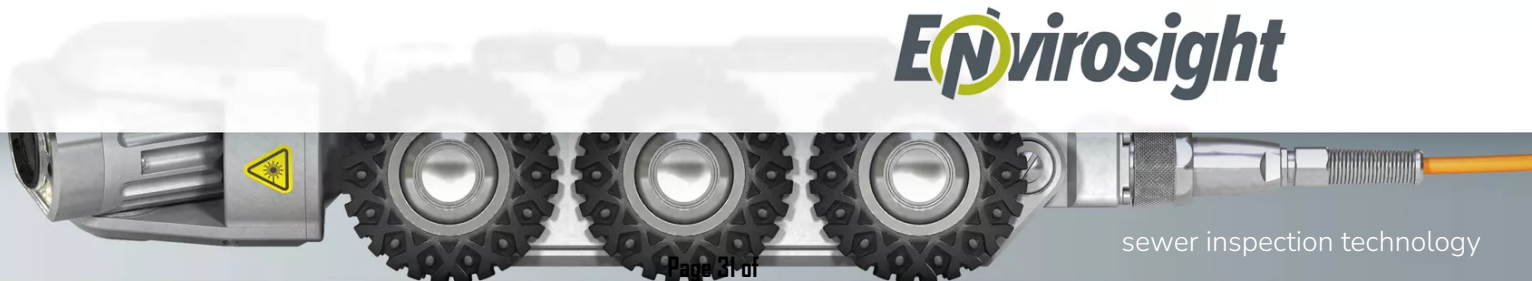

SECTION I - Project Description

WHEREAS, the State has identified the need for the described project:

To perform route sign replacements on the following routes: MED State Route 0303 SLM 05.99 (West Corp. Limit) to SLM 09.81 (East Corp. Limit) in the City of Brunswick of Medina County.

This project is currently scheduled to be constructed in the summer of 2022.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City of Brunswick of Medina County, Ohio.

SECTION II - Consent Statement

Being in the public interest, the City gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the above described project.

SECTION III - Cooperation Statement

- 1) *The City gives consent for the above improvement,*
- 2) *No funds are required from the City except that the City agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the total cost for added construction items requested by the City and not necessary for the improvement as determined by the State and the Federal Highway Administration.*

SECTION IV - Maintenance

Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the City shall:

- 1) *Provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal law;*
- 2) *Provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the described project;*
- 3) *Maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.*

SECTION V – Utilities and Right-of-Way Statement

If city owned utilities, within a corporation limit or in a private easement outside corporation limits, need to be relocated due to this ODOT project, the City will be reimbursed for any relocation work; ODOT will perform the coordination, relocation, and reimbursement which shall comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

If other public and private utilities need to be relocated due to this ODOT project they will not be reimbursed for relocation; with exceptions due to an easement, etc.

SECTION VI - Authority to Sign

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION PROVIDING CONSENT TO THE OHIO
DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE PERFORMANCE OF
THE STATE ROUTE 303 ROUTE SIGN REPLACEMENT PROJECT.

WHEREAS: The Ohio Department of Transportation (“ODOT”) has identified the need to perform route sign replacements on State Route 303 in the City (the “Project”); and

WHEREAS: ODOT will complete the Project at no cost to the City, which Project is estimated to be constructed in the summer of 2022.

WHEREAS: THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1: That being in the public interest, the City hereby provides its consent to ODOT to complete the Project. The City agrees to pay 100% of the cost of added construction items requested by the City that are not necessary for the Project as determined by ODOT and the Federal Highway Administration.

SECTION 2: The City agrees that upon completion of the Project, and unless otherwise agreed, to provide adequate maintenance in accordance with applicable State and Federal regulations, to provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the Project, and to maintain the right-of-way free of obstructions and hold same inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION 3: That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed, upon approval of the Law Director, to execute any document with the Director of Transportation necessary for the Project.

SECTION 4: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety or welfare, and for the additional reason to ensure timely submission of this consent legislation to ODOT by February 11, 2022 to allow for the Project. Therefore, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the required number of votes or from the earliest time allowed by law.
