MOTION: Motion authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Cathy's House and to direct the Ohio Opioid Settlement funds received by the City of Brunswick in 2022 to Cathy's House to assist in rehabilitation efforts

BACKGROUND: The City of Brunswick was named as one of 2,000 local governments in Ohio receiving opioid lawsuit settlement money to be disbursed over 18 years. For the year 2022, the disbursement is \$10,348.58 to the City of Brunswick. The City Administration recommends directing these funds to services rendered in the City of Brunswick by Cathy's House.

**PURPOSE AND
EXPLANATION:**

Funds from any settlement dollars should be used to prevent, treat and support recovery from addiction including opioids and/or any other co-occurring substance use and/or mental health conditions which are all long-lasting (chronic) diseases that can cause major health, social, and economic problems at the individual, family and/or community level. The Executive Director of Cathy's House attended the September 26, 2022 Committee of the Whole meeting to discuss their services in the City of Brunswick and answer questions from City Council.

**IMPLEMENTATION
SCHEDULE:**

With approval of Brunswick City Council, the City Manager will authorize the agreement with Cathy's House and authorize the Finance Director to prepare a purchase order and remit the 2022 Brunswick Opioid Settlement amount of \$10,348.58 to Cathy's House.

BACKGROUND: This is a semi-annual codification update.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: To approve the editing and inclusion of ordinances as components of the codified ordinances; to provide for the adoption of new legislation in the updated revised codified ordinances; and to repeal ordinances in conflict therewith.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: To adopt as an emergency with suspension of the rules on October 10, 2022, to allow for the updates to be effective immediately.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: City Council codification expenses are budgeted in account #001-0100-54279. Purchase order approvals will be subject to the available Council appropriations at the time the P.O. is submitted. ORDINANCE NUMBER 92-2022

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE EDITING AND INCLUSION OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES AS COMPONENTS OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADOPTION OF NEW LEGISLATION IN THE UPDATED REVISED CODIFIED ORDINANCES; AND TO REPEAL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

WHEREAS: Section 3.18b. of the City Charter provides for the general codification of all City ordinances and resolutions having the force and effect of law and requires that such codification be kept current; and

WHEREAS: The Walter H. Drane Co. has completed its updating and revision of the Codified Ordinances of the City; and

WHEREAS: Various ordinances of a general and permanent nature that have been enacted by Council since the date of the last updating and revision of the Codified Ordinances need to be included in the Codified Ordinances of the City; and

WHEREAS: Certain changes made in the Codified Ordinances to bring City law into conformity with State law.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: That the editing, arrangement and numbering or renumbering of the ordinances and parts of ordinances attached hereto as "Exhibit "A" as though fully herein written, are hereby approved as parts of the various component codes of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Brunswick, Ohio, so as to conform to the classification and numbering system of the Codified Ordinances.

SECTION 2: That the sections of the Traffic and General Offenses Codes, as amended and attached hereto as Exhibit "B" as though fully herein written, are hereby approved and adopted as amended or enacted so as to conform to enactments of the Ohio General Assembly.

SECTION 3: That all ordinances and resolutions and parts thereof that are in conflict with any of the provisions of the new matter approved, adopted and listed on Exhibit "A" and in Section 1 are hereby repealed, except as follows:

- (a) The enactment of such matter shall not be construed to affect a right of liability accrued or incurred under any legislative provision prior to the effective date of such enactment, or any action or proceeding for the enforcement of such right or liability. Such enactment shall not be construed to relieve any person from punishment for an act committed in violation of any such legislative provision or to affect an indictment or prosecution therefor. For such purposes, any such legislative provision shall continue in full force notwithstanding its repeal for the purposes of revision and recodification.
- (b) The repeal provided above shall not affect any legislation enacted subsequent to December 16, 2019

SECTION 4: That a copy of this ordinance shall be posted in the five public places set forth in Section 222.01 of the Codified Ordinances, together with notice as to where copies of the August 2022 Replacement Pages for the Codified Ordinances of the City, hereby approved, adopted and enacted, may be viewed and inspected by the public. A copy shall also be furnished to City Officers, Medina County Law Library and the Brunswick Public Library.

SECTION 5: That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the additional reason that it is immediately necessary to have an up-to-date codification of the laws of the City, pursuant to Section 3.18b. of the City Charter, that is in conformity with State Law, where such conformity is required by Article XVIII, Section 3, of the Ohio Constitution, with which to administer the affairs of the City and to preserve law and order of the City. Therefore, this Ordinance and the August 2022 Replacement Pages for the Codified Ordinances, hereby approved, adopted and enacted, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the required number of votes, as set forth in Section 3.16 of the City Charter.
