LEGISLATION: **RES. NO. 98-2022** - An emergency resolution granting consent to the Ohio Department of Transportation to complete the US 42 (Pearl Road) Pavement Replacement Project. - **1st Reading** (To be brought from Services, Utilities, Technology & Cable Committee, Administration/Matt Jones)

BACKGROUND: The proposed project will replace pavement, storm sewers, and curbing on US 42 (Pearl Road) from Fenn Road to the Brunswick full corporation limit north of Sleepy Hollow Road.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: This resolution will give the City's consent to ODOT to complete the project. A small portion of the project falls within the City of Brunswick, along the east side of Pearl Road between Sleepy Hollow Road and the Brunswick full corporation limit south of Arlington Drive/Chaseline Ridge. The northern project terminus corresponds with the southern terminus of the Pearl Road Resurfacing project that is currently under construction.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: The project is currently slated to begin construction in late summer 2024 and be completed in 2026.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: No funds are required from the City, except that the City agrees to assume and bear 100% of the total cost for added construction items requested by the City and not necessary for the improvement as determined by the State and the Federal Highway Administration.

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION GRANTING CONSENT TO THE OHIO
DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO COMPLETE THE US 42
(PEARL ROAD) PAVEMENT REPLACEMENT PROJECT.

WHEREAS: The Ohio Department of Transportation (“ODOT”) will be completing the US 42 (Pearl Road) Pavement Replacement Project (the “Project”) in Medina County, which Project will include replacement of pavement, storm sewers and curbing.

WHEREAS: THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1: That being in the public interest, the City hereby grants consent to ODOT to complete the Project within the municipal limits of the City. No funds are required from the City for the Project, except that the City agrees to assume and bear 100% of the total cost for added construction items requested by the City and not necessary for the Project as determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration.

SECTION 2: The City agrees that upon completion of the Project, and unless otherwise agreed, to provide adequate maintenance in accordance with applicable State and Federal regulations, to provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the Project, and to maintain the right-of-way free of obstructions and hold same inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION 3: If City owned utilities, within a corporation limit or in a private easement outside corporation limits, need to be relocated due to the Project, the City will be reimbursed for any relocation work; ODOT will perform the coordination, relocation and reimbursement which shall comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual; if other public and private utilities need to be relocated due to the Project, they will not be reimbursed for relocation subject to applicable exceptions.

SECTION 4: That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed, upon approval of the Law Director, to execute any document with the Director of Transportation necessary for the Project.

SECTION 5: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety or welfare, and for the additional reason to ensure timely submission of this consent legislation to ODOT to allow for the Project. Therefore, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the required number of votes or from the earliest time allowed by law.

LEGISLATION: **RES. NO. 99-2022** - An emergency resolution authorizing the City to become a member of the Community University Education Purchasing Regional Council of Governments. - **1st Reading** (To be brought from Services, Utilities, Technology & Cable Committee, Administration/Paul Barnett)

BACKGROUND: The City of Brunswick became a member of the Community University Education Purchasing Association(CUE) authorized by the passage of Resolution Number 10-2022. This organization has over 50 members, which allows for the bidding of commodities in bulk. This organization is disbanding and reforming as a "Council of Government's" to better serve its members and our citizens.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: The purpose of this legislation is to allow for the purchase of commodities at the lowest possible price.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: The CUE-COG is scheduled to be active by the end of 2022. Our intention is to be a member of the new organization when the organization becomes active in order to be able to continue to save money on purchases.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: Membership dues are currently around \$200/year (001-0880-53258). Cost of the membership would go through the normal purchase order and budgeting process and follow State and location Laws. Any purchases recommended at a later date through the COG would follow those same laws. Furthermore, if the purchase would be over the current \$25,000 threshold, separate approval by City Council for that purchase would be required.

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO BECOME
A MEMBER OF THE COMMUNITY UNIVERSITY EDUCATION
PURCHASING REGIONAL COUNCIL OF GOVERNEMENTS.

WHEREAS: On February 4, 2020, City Council adopted Resolution No. 10-2020 authorizing the City to enroll in the Community University Education Purchasing Association (“CUE”) to participate in joint purchasing programs.

WHEREAS: On or about October 18, 2022, CUE was reorganized to the Community University Education Purchasing Regional Council of Governments (“CUE-COG”).

WHEREAS: THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1: That this Council hereby affirms the City’s participation and membership in the CUE-COG.

SECTION 2: That the City Manager, upon approval of the Law Director, is authorized to execute all necessary documents to become a Member of the CUE-COG.

SECTION 3: That the City Manager is authorized to appoint a Representative and Alternative Representative to represent the City on the CUE-COG.

SECTION 4: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety or welfare, and for the additional reason that the first meeting of the CUE-COG is scheduled for November 16, 2022. Therefore, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the required number of votes or from the earliest time allowed by law.
