MOTION: Motion authorizing the City Manager to advertise for public bids for the North Park Lake Dredging Project

BACKGROUND: This project was first identified in the Healey Creek Watershed Study, and was subsequently granted \$1.5 million in State and Tribal Assistance Grant (STAG) funding from the United States EPA in conjunction with the upcoming Aster Place Detention Modification project.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: The project will consist of the removal of a significant quantity of sediment from the bottom of North Park Lake, with the intention of improving water quality and flood storage capacity in the lake and downstream in Healey Creek.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: Should authorization to bid be secured at the June 24, 2024 committee of the whole meeting, the project will be advertised and awarded in July pending receipt of the final grant agreement documents from the US EPA. Construction is anticipated to begin in late August.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: The City is completing the EPA application process for the North Park Dredging project from the \$1.5 million award from the Community Grants Program. The application for The Aster Place Detention Modification project will be completed separately. The grant proceeds will be used to fund the construction costs only. Upon receipt of the final grant agreement, the construction contract can be awarded. The preliminary construction cost estimate is \$927,000, and the award and disbursements will be accounted for in Fund# 337 (EPA Grant Fund).

Total costs, including engineering and inspections, are estimated at \$1,163,929.00

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Passage of a motion which authorizes the City Manager to advertise for and seek public bids for the North Park Lake Dredging project.

BACKGROUND: New request

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: The project is planned to be funded with the Stormwater Utility Fee fund, Acct# 224-0240-54265, upon Council's approval.
Construction budget is \$150,000.00
