MOTION: Motion to advertise a Request For Proposals for City Hall parking lots to replace seven (7) square tube light poles and twenty-five (25) existing MH light fixtures in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.00.

BACKGROUND: Seven (7) 20' square tube light poles will be replaced and twenty-five (25) existing MH light fixtures will be replaced with LED equivalent type fixtures (7 on new poles, 16 on existing poles, and 2 spare fixtures). Additionally, new poles will require new wiring in the poles only; all underground wiring will be reused. Two (2) new photocells will be needed to replace old and outdated photocells; one (1) for the front parking lot and one (1) for the rear.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: Contractor will be responsible for the removal and disposal of all old light poles and fixtures, and for securing work areas.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: April 28, 2025.
