MOTION: Motion authorizing the City Manager to advertise for public bids for the 2026 Asphalt Program.

BACKGROUND: The proposed project will seek to rehabilitate, repair and resurface existing deteriorated asphalt and concrete pavement on various streets in Wards 3 and 4, improving neighborhood accessibility and safety to the traveling public.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: The proposed project will include resurfacing of existing asphalt streets in Wards 3 and 4 and will remove and replace deteriorated concrete pavement joints, slabs, curbs and install a chip seal interlayer and asphalt overlay on various streets in Wards 3 and 4. Concrete street repairs in Wards 1 and 2 are being addressed in a separate project, which will go out to bid in late March/April.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: Should authorization to bid be secured at the February 9, 2026 committee of the whole meeting, the project will be advertised in February/March. Construction is anticipated to begin in May.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: Preliminary construction cost estimate is not to exceed \$1,600,000.00.

Budgeted costs for the 2026 neighborhood road asphalt program are preliminarily budgeted to be split 35% Road Levy Fund #332; 20% Streets R&M Fund #117 and 45% Road Capital Projects Fund #333. Once the bids are received, the lowest and best bid will be determined, and we will compare the bid results to the budgeted amounts at that time.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Passage of a motion which authorizes the City Manager to advertise for and seek public bids for the 2026 Asphalt Road Program.

MOTION: Motion authorizing the City Manager to advertise for public bids for the Maxwell Laurel Intersection Improvements Project.

BACKGROUND: The proposed project will seek to rehabilitate pavement between Pinewood Drive and Coventry Drive, including the installation of a roundabout at the intersection of Maxwell Boulevard and Laurel Road.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: The proposed project will impact pavement from Pinewood Drive to Coventry Drive. The intersection of Maxwell Boulevard and Laurel Road will be realigned through the construction of a roundabout. The pavement outside the limits of the roundabout will be repaired with concrete base repairs and asphalt resurfacing. New catch basins and storm sewers will be installed as part of the project.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: Should authorization to bid be secured at the February 9, 2026 committee of the whole meeting, the project will be advertised in February/March. Construction is anticipated to begin in May.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: The preliminary construction cost estimate is \$1,117,500, excluding contingencies. The project is planned to be partially funded (OPWC Laurel/Maxwell Intersection Improvement Fund #371) with a grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission in the amount of \$720,000. The remainder of the cost of this project is expected to be paid from City local funds from the Road Improvement Fund #333.

The City will analyze the bid results and related funding package before recommending the lowest and best bid received.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Passage of a motion which authorizes the City Manager to advertise for and seek public bids for the Laurel Maxwell Intersection Improvements Project.
