SECTION 2: That the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the Ohio General Assembly and Ohio Governor John Kasich.

SECTION 3: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, and safety and for the additional reason that this Council wants to express its opposition to any proposed legislation that adversely affects the rights of workers. Therefore, the same shall be in full force from and after its passage by the required number of votes or from the earliest time allowed by law.
