LEGISLATION: **RES. NO. 27-2026** - An emergency resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Konstruction King, Inc. for the 2026 Concrete Repair Program in an amount not to exceed \$498,500.00. - **1st Reading** (To be brought from Services, Utilities, Technology & Cable Committee, *Administration/Jenny Zoldak*)

BACKGROUND: Authorization for public bid granted by City Council motion on March 9, 2026. Bids were opened on April 8, 2026. 4 bids were received. Konstruction King, Inc. was the lowest and best bidder with a base bid of \$498,500.00.

PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION: The proposed project will remove and replace deteriorated concrete pavement joints/slabs/curbs in Wards 1 and 2. The streets in Ward 1 will be Junior Parkway, Ashleigh Drive and Briarleigh Drive. The streets in Ward 2 will be Eisenhower Drive, Fillmore Drive, Taft Drive and Polk Drive. Residential street repairs in Wards 3 and 4 are being addressed in a separate concurrent project. The Concrete Program will also include repair of catch basins in various locations throughout the City.

IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE: The project is anticipated to commence in May and is scheduled for completion within 60 days.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: A total amount not to exceed \$498,500.00. The costs have been budgeted to be split as follows:
1) 35% or \$174,475 to the Road Levy Fund #332, account#332-0473-56881;
2) 20% or \$99,700.00 Streets R&M Fund #117, account #117-0420-56881; and,
3) 45% or \$224,325.00 Road Capital Projects Fund #333-account #333-0474-56870.

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH KONSTRUCTION KING, INC. FOR THE 2026 CONCRETE REPAIR PROGRAM IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$498,500.00.

WHEREAS: The City of Brunswick received four (4) bids for the 2026 Concrete Repair Program (the “Project”), in accordance with public bidding requirements; and

WHEREAS: The four (4) received public bids were opened on April 8, 2026, with Konstruction King, Inc. determined to be the lowest and/or best bidder.

WHEREAS: THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1: That the City Manager, with the approval of the Law Director, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an Agreement with Konstruction King, Inc., the lowest and/or best bidder, for the 2026 Concrete Repair Program in an amount not to exceed \$498,500.00.

SECTION 2: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety or welfare, and for the additional reason that immediate passage is necessary for completion of the Project during the 2026 construction season. Therefore, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the required number of votes or from the earliest time allowed by law.
